From the Desk of the Pastor



Dear Friends,

We begin our forty-day Lenten Journey on Ash Wednesday. The Blessing of the ashes reads, *“let us humbly ask God our Father that he be pleased to bless these ashes, which we will put on our heads in penitence.”* We move around that day with ashes on our foreheads, a true sign of humility. Even more so, the ashes tell we are sinners, and we have embarked on a journey of returning to the Lord. As you probably heard me say before, each Lent is to be different from the Lent before. How beautiful it is that we are given forty days each year, before the celebration of Easter, to move closer to the Lord through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. How are you going to spend these days of Lent? I encourage you to spend time in extra prayer. When we lift our hearts to the Lord in prayer, we grow in holiness. I encourage you to attend mass each week during Lent. Perhaps you would like to attend daily mass on Wednesdays. I encourage you to increase your tithes to our church during Lent, and/or place money in the poor box that can be used to assist the poor and homeless who often visit our church. Most importantly, with contrite hearts, let’s remember our sinfulness and joyful return to the Lord.

Please take home a copy of our church Lenten events. Also, as I do every year, I ordered you a copy of Pope Francis’ Spiritual Reflections for each day throughout Lent. This Lenten Season, Pope Francis explores the theme “A New Beginning.”
